





1. Border closing to control the spread of the pandemic:

Conclusions

For the 2021-2025 period, the Commission has proposed re-focusing its narrative and actions along four main clusters – all of which would take account of the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic and the lessons learned from it -> Border regions need to become more resilient in their governance:

- Public services in border regions: Cross-border health care, public transport, joint digital services, rescue and emergency services
- · Green Deal implementation
- Labour market and education: Labour mobility in all its dimensions (access to jobs, fight against brain drain, etc)
- Institutional cooperation: Governance of cross-border regions and their key services to citizens + integrated and comprehensive approach to security.
